**The EMG Report**, prepared by more than 40 UN entities, provides a picture on the UN system wide perspectives on how the UN system could coherently support countries in transitioning to a Green Economy. The report is expected to facilitate a common understanding of the Green Economy approach and the measures required for the transition.

**The UNDG Survey**, to which 57 UN Country Teams (UNCT) responded, puts forth a set of observations and recommendations on how the United Nations at country level can better support Member States to further the Rio+20 themes in their countries. The Survey presents concrete examples of UNCTs working with Governments on, inter alia, Green Economy issues.
